Greetings to my GFWC/ lowa sisters:

March—in like a lamb, out like a lion! Let's let our GFWC/Iowa voices ROAR. Pat yourselves on the back for the amazing amount of volunteer hours, dollars donated and in-kind donations you all did and made in 2022 to better our communities through volunteer service. The reports I read were awesome and inspiring. Our current statistics show that we have 637 members statewide in 37 clubs. In the Community Service Program and GFWC Special Programs, 415 projects were reported with 10,800 volunteers hours. \$37,233 dollars donated and \$54,132 in-kind donations. In the Advancement areas of Communications. Leadership, Legislation

and Membership, 191 projects were reported with 3,428 volunteer hours and \$17,444 dollars spent in furtherance of those GFWC areas. In Fundraising in our communities, 19 projects were reported with 2,042 volunteer activities and \$34,654 donated to our local communities. Great job!

March is National Kidney Month

Our kidneys regulate fluid levels, activate Vitamin D for healthy bones, filter waste from our blood, direct the production of red blood cells, regulate blood pressure and keep blood minerals in balance. Diabetes, high blood pressure, family history

and being over the age of 60 are common risk factors. Symptoms of kidney disease may include swelling of the face, feet, ankles, abdomen and hands; increased thirst; puffy eyes, fatigue; difficult painful urination; blood in the urine or foamy urine. Nutrition is key to managing kidney health. A diet low in salt, sodium, sugar, sweets, fat and red meat is important. A diet rich in fruits and vegetables, whole grains, low -fat dairy, fish, poultry, nuts and seeds is recommended.
